

SCALDWELL LISTED BUILDINGS

Number / Name The Old House

Description House. Mid C18. Squared coursed lias with slate roof. Lobby-entry plan. 2 storeys with attic, 3-window range of casements with leaded lights under wood lintels. Central C20 door under wood lintel. Ashlar gable parapets, restored C20. Central brick stack. Late C18 wing to rear. Interior: Central stack has remains of open fireplaces with bressumers; chamfered ceiling beams.

Number / Name Home Farmhouse

Description Farmhouse, now house. Datestone 1615. Squared coursed lias with slate and concrete tile roofs. Originally probably L-shaped plan now T-shaped. 2 storeys with attic. Rear elevations each of 2-window range, those to left are casements with leaded lights under wood lintels. C19 square bay window to right. C19 porch and door in centre. Ashlar gable parapets to north and east wings with brick stacks at ends. Wing to left is probably C19. Elevation to road has C19 tripartite sashes. Datestone in north gable. INTERIOR: Room to left of entrance has open fireplace with bressumer. Chamfered and stopped ceiling beams. Cellar under west wing has 2-light stone mullion window below ground level. Butt purlin roof structure. First floor room of barn attached to south was used as an early C19 nonconformist chapel and retains simple pulpit with fielded panelling.

Number / Name Rectory Farmhouse

Description Farmhouse, now house. Mid C18. Regular coursed has with C20 plain tile roof. Originally 2-unit plan. 2 storeys; 3- window range of casements. Those at first floor have glazing bars; all have early C20 moulded plaster surrounds. Central C20 door. Brick stacks at ends.

Number / Name Wall attached to S of Rectory Farmhouse

Description Wall. Probably Mid C18. Squared coursed lias with ashlar coping. Wooden gate to centre has raised section of wall over. Section of wall to right is swept forward. Included for group value.

Number / Name Scaldwell House

Description House. Mid C18 remodelled late C19. Brick with lias ashlar dressings, and slate roof. Originally 2-unit plan. 2 storeys with attic, 6-window range of C19 sashes with moulded stone architraves, 5 of which are original C18 openings. Central C19 door has moulded stone architrave flanked by C19 tripartite sashes with moulded stone architraves. Rusticated quoins. Ashlar gable parapets and brick stacks. C19 roof dormers. Right gable is C18. Left was rebuilt C19. Single-storey billiard room to right has datestone 1884. Interior has C18 staircase with turned balusters and quarter landings forming a narrow well to the attic storey.

Number / Name The Old Fox

Description Public house now house. Mid C18. Regular coursed lias with C20 plain tiled roof: 2-unit plan. 2 storeys, 2-window range. Central 4-panelled door under wood lintel. Casement windows with glazing bars under wood lintels. Those at first floor have remains of moulded stone surrounds. Brick stacks at ends. Interior not inspected but noted as having open fireplace with bressumer and ceiling beams.

Number / Name The Old Rectory (formerly listed as The Rectory)

Description Rectory, now house. Datestone 1716. Lias ashlar with slate roof. Double-depth plan. East facade, 5-window range. Centre breaks forward as 2-storey pedimented porch with 6-panelled door having moulded stone architrave and moulded keystone. Sash windows have glazing bars and flat stone architraves with moulded inner edge and keyblock. Ground-floor windows to left are blank. Plain string course between storeys and rusticated quoins at corners. Ashlar cornice, gable parapet and kneelers, 3 pedimented roof dormers. Ashlar stacks with moulded cornice at ridge. Crest with date above entrance. Sundial to left gable. C19 extensions to rear with limestone bay to south. Interior: Mid C18 staircase with simple turned balusters.

Number / Name Sundial House

Description House. Datestones 1650 and 1772. Squared coursed lias with slate roof. 2-unit plan. 2 storeys with attic; 3-window range of C19 sashes under flat arches; those at ground floor are wider. C19 glazed door to left. Ashlar cornice, gable parapets and kneelers. Ashlar stacks at ends C20 roof dormers. Large sundial dated 1650 between first-floor windows, probably C20 restoration. Datestone 1650 and

1772 to left and right gables. C19 wing to left of 2-window range of casements with leaded lights has door to left.

Number / Name The Grange

Description House. Early C19. Brick and stucco with slate roof. 2-unit plan. 2-storey, 3-window range. Central 6-panelled door with fanlight over has projecting stone porch with detached columns, plain entablature and cornice. Sash windows have glazing bars with moulded architraves; those at ground floor have bracketed hoods over projecting string course between storeys and broad pilasters between windows. Shallow hipped roof with dentilled cornice and lateral brick stacks. Elevations to left and right are similar stucco; wing to rear is brick. Interior: Early C19 staircase with quarter landings has plain balustrade.

Number / Name The Manor House

Description Manor House. Late C17 altered C19. Squared coursed lias with slate roof. 3-unit plan. 2-storey, 3-window range. C19 six-panelled door to left of centre has C20 porch. 6-light stone mullioned window in centre of ground floor with similar 4-light window above. Other windows have moulded stone surrounds with C19 sashes; those to right have flat arches. C19 hipped roof with brick stacks at ridge and end. Interior: Room to far right has open fireplace with bressumer; several 6-panelled doors.

Number / Name Church of St Peter and St Paul

Description Church. C12 to C14 with C19 restoration by Williams, Slater and Gillett. Regular coursed and squared coursed lias with ashlar dressings. Aluminium and lead roofs. Aisled nave and chancel and west tower. South aisle is of 2-window range. That to right is probably C19 reconstruction with double lancet window and door to right and 3-light east window with intersecting tracery. That to left is C14 with 3-light Perpendicular window. Gabled roof with ashlar parapets. C14 gabled porch to left has double chamfered arch. Single lancet west window. Lean-to roof with plain parapets. North aisle of 2-window range has 2-light window with intersecting tracery to left and 3-light Perpendicular window to right. 3-light Perpendicular east window and 2-light west window with intersecting tracery. Blank lancet to left. Large ashlar angle and clasping buttresses. Gabled roof with ashlar gable parapets and finial. 5-light Perpendicular east window to chancel with small quatrefoil and gabled parapet with finial above. North nave clerestory of 3-window range of square windows with quatrefoils. Ashlar cornice. Gabled roof with ashlar abutment parapet with bellcote at apex. West tower C12 of 3 stages. Single lancets in south and west face of third stage. Upper stage recessed has 2-light round headed bell chamber openings in round-headed opening with simple shaft between to each face. Plain ashlar cornice and parapets with pinnacles at corners. INTERIOR: Chancel: 2-bay north arcade of double chamfered pointed arches with octagonal piers. Single C19 double chamfered arch to south. Double chamfered chancel and side chapel arches. 2-bay nave arcade of double chamfered pointed arches with octagonal piers; those to the north are taller. Plain pointed tower arch, blocked. C19 roofs, ceiling panels to the chancel are painted. Stained glass to east window and south aisle. C14 piscina in south aisle. C19 ashlar chancel screen. Font probably C13 bowl on cluster of shafts.

Description Churchyard cross. Probably C14. Limestone. Base only remains with square socket hole and chamfered corners.

Number / Name The Old Thatch

Description Two houses now one. Mid C18. Squared coursed lias with C2C) concrete tiled roof. Originally each of two-unit plan. 2 storeys, 4-window range of casements with leaded lights and some original glass, one horizontal sash at ground floor left. All have wood lintels. 2 doors between windows, 4-panelled to left and 8-panelled to right. Ashlar gable parapets with brick stack to ridge and end. Interior not inspected but room to left of centre noted as having open fireplace with bressumer.
